1) Many children seemed to be battling a lot of anger and frustration. Some struggled with sharing and interacting with other children. Others were quick to 'lash out' at other children




2) In our art-focused sessions, we noticed that some children drew pictures of people in boats on the ocean, with rain falling down on them.

The Right to Play

 One of our sessions was disrupted by the presence of politicians and news people who wanted to thoroughly question minors about the details of their journeys.
